19. The First Discourse (John 13:31 - 14:31)

19. Scene A. The Transition

Moves from narrative of footwashing to farewell discourse Through chapters 16 or 17 Picks up on John 13:1: He loved them to the end Waits until Judas is gone before expressing what is in His heart John 13:31– Greek "therefore" Sometimes one person can derail a discussion Major theme of this section is love 13:31-38: 14:15, 21,23,24,31 Modeled on Jesus' love for us (13:31-35) Empowered by the Holy Spirit (14:16-26) We love in the way we have been loved

19. Scene B. The Background: Farewell Discourses in Judaism

Old Testament Jacob (Gen 47-49) Joshua (Josh 22-24) David (1 Chr 28-29) Intertestamental period Tobit (14) Enoch (1 Enoch 91) Ezra (2 Esdras 14)

Paul

Acts 20; 2 Tim 3-4 An established literary genre in the ancient world

19. Scene C. Love and Discipleship (John 13:31-38)

<u>John 13:33</u>– Central theme of whole farewell discourse I am going away and you cannot follow Statement sandwiched by "glory" and "love" John 13:31-32– five uses of "glory"

In John "glory" comes at the cross Often translated "boasting," "honor," or "praise" Jesus' mission is to reveal the loving character of God John 13:34-35- four uses of "love" Greek: The Four Loves Verb for agape here Self-sacrificing love (just like Jesus) Disciple's mission is to love others When it hurts When it's inconvenient When others mock it Then everyone will know something special is going on New commandment not new in content Clearer Enhancement of Lev 19:18– Love your neighbor Love in light of self-sacrifice on the cross (God's love) As He has loved us 1 Corinthians 13 Eph 4:32 **Daily forgiveness**

19. Scene D. Going Away and Returning (John 14:1-3)

Why are the disciples troubled? Distorted view of the Messiah Daniel 2, Triumphal Entry (G 2: 37-38) Deliberate double meaning Return through the Spirit Second Coming The Millennium (Rev 20) Only text in Bible on location of believers during Millennium Not on earth, but in heaven

19. Scene E. Sound Bites (John 14:4-31)

John 14:6– The Way, the Truth and the Life Summarizes the main themes of the Gospel The way to the Father (1:12,18; 14:1-10) Show us what God is like The truth about the Father (prologue) About His character About the things of heaven Life is what all who believe receive (prologue; 5:24) Not politically correct (because Jesus has been reduced to a politcal pawn) But He is simple enough and broad enough for all to appreciate Is there room for Muslims, Buddhists, etc. here?

John 14:9-

Jesus is what the Father is like

No split between OT and NT God

Jesus is God of the OT (Paul and Revelation)

The Father is God of the NT (John)

John 14:12– Greater works than Jesus?

Earthly Jesus subject to human limitations

Time and space

Ascension removes those limitation

HS and disciples now become agents to manifest God's character Millions of disciples extend Jesus' work

Greatest work? Second generation

John 14:15-27-

Jesus obeyed the Father To love Him is to obey His commands Empowered by the Holy Spirit

John 14:30-31-

Jesus anxious to get on with the battle (Satan)

Only call to leave the room

15-16 either stand and linger or along the way

18:1 in Gethsemane
