23. Scene A. The Structure

Farewell Discourse closes with intercessory prayer in three parts Verses 1-5– Jesus prays for Himself Verses 6-19– Jesus prays for His disciples How they will fare when He is gone Verses 20-26– Jesus prays for the second generation Focus of the prayer is on unity Still seem to be in Upper Room (John 18:1)

23. Scene B. Jesus Prays for Himself (John 17:1-5)

<u>John 17:1, 5</u>–

Jesus wants to be glorified The glory of the cross (<u>Gal 6:14</u>) So He can glorify the Father By completing His work on earth (cross) By exalting Him back to His pre-human state Jesus' glory is His character (especially the cross) Turned the other cheek Did not force His way into our hearts In Him we see what the Father is like The meaning of *Abba* (Daddy)

John 17:3-

Focus on the results of verse 1 Eternal life for human beings Grounded in "knowing" God By knowing Jesus Jesus is the closest we can come to seeing, hearing, touching God 23. Scene C. Jesus Prays for His Disciples (John 17:6-19) John 17:6– Attention turns to the disciples They belong to the Father Jesus' revelation of God is for their benefit (cf. 7-8) Name = glory = character Identifying marks of a believer John 17:8 Believe in Jesus (John 3:16) Believe in Him as Creator (John 1:3) Also Eph 3:9; Col 1:16-17; Heb 1:2-3; Rev 14:7 (G 2: 83-84) Jesus prays for the disciples because they are staying in the world (9-11) Need divine support (John 17:13-17) Jesus prays for three things Protected from the world's hatred (12-15) Have joy in spite of His departure (John 17:13) Sanctified by the truth (17) Equipped for the task: replacing Jesus We need to be strong for the truth Society today has an aversion to truth John 17:18-19– The importance of witnessing/evangelism Scene D. Jesus Prays for the Second Generation (John 17:20-26) John 17:20-Those who come to believe through the disciples' word Particularly: The Gospel of John Includes all Christians after the first generation John 17:21-23-Unity of Jesus with Father inspires unity on earth You become like the God you worship Unity of the church will attract the world Our lives as a community portrays what God is like John 13:34-35; Eph 1:9-10 A bitterly divided church makes God look bad This is not organizational unity Had that in the Middle Ages That caused many to turn away from Jesus Crusades, Inquisition, French Revolution What unity really is With each other through the Word and prayer Not uniformity Will not bring harmony with the world Disciples came to know the Father through Jesus Through the Spirit that process continues

John 17:25-26- Unity in love

Joy without love is hedonism Holiness without love is hedonism Truth without love is mere orthodoxy Unity without love is tyranny
